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HOW TO OVERCOME TRANSACTIONAL DISTANCE EFFECT ON ONLINE LEARNING DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Abstract

This study examines transactional distance in online learning during the covid-19 pandemic. Aspects related to student learning independence, lecture design structure, especially dialogue/interaction between students and lecture content, students and equipment, students and lecturers, and between students are the main focus of studies that can provide alternative actions to overcome the effects of transactional distance. A survey involving 35 students majoring in mathematics education, FKIP, Sultan Ageng Tirtayasa University, contracted the Research Methodology course. More specific information regarding transactional distance was then obtained through semi-structured interviews
